Before becoming the Chief Operating Officer of Sirius America in 2009, he was President and CEO of the Sirius Global Services operations. Prior to joining Sirius America, he was employed by American Re-Insurance Company, CIGNA and Liberty Mutual.

He has a great knowledge of the organization and will provide strong leadership in working with our clients and brokers.”
